Why is land conservation important to you?

We asked some of our supporters this question, and there was a common sentiment: land conservation means more than just conserving land, but conserving the wonderful relationships you have with it.

By supporting USVLT, you're protecting more than just the forests, farms, and waterways of the Valley. You're protecting its tranquility. You're protecting its wonder. You're protecting its ability to inspire, and you're protecting all of this for generations to come.

This year, you ensured that the open fields of Bun Lucy Farm, the tranquil trails of Tin Mountain Arboretum, and the majestic views of Jockey Cap are forever protected. To date, you have saved over 12,000 acres of land in our Valley. That is remarkable!

And it is only possible because of you. You are the guardians of the forests, wildlife, farms, and waterways of the Valley. Every acre of land you preserve at USVLT is protected forever.

But these lands are under threat of unsustainable development. It is too late for some of the special areas that are already gone, but together we can save those places that are still worth preserving.

We're currently putting our focus towards 8 different projects—3 of which we're hoping to finish by the end of the year—and have almost a dozen others in the woodworks. **[To bring these projects to fruition, we ask for your support./We recognize and appreciate your recent support, and we're sharing this letter to let you know what is happening at USVLT.]** None of this would be possible without supporters like you, and it's through your dedication that the Valley remains such a uniquely wonderful place.
